Here is some information about the climate in Borneo

Borneo has an equatorial climate and is generally warm and humid all year round. Temperatures rarely get above 32°C except on really hot days, and along the coastal areas they hardly ever drop below 20°C at night. Away from the coast and at higher altitudes it can get quite cool at night.

Rainfall is common throughout the year, and can range from about 150 cm to over 450 cm per year. In most parts of Borneo, the wettest months occur during the North East Monsoon from October through to February and the driest months during the South West Monsoon between March and September.
